

Corvedale Church of England (Aided) Primary School Pupil Premium Statement 2016-17

The Final Pupil Premium grant for the academic year 2016-17 was £18,525

Main Barriers to Educational Achievement:

- Because the school's PP families are low income, school expenses uniform, trips and extracurricular experiences are unattainable due to cost.
- A significant proportion of under attaining PP children are on the school's SEN Register.
- Emotional and social issues are prevalent among the school's PP children.

This money has been spent on those children in receipt of the grant in the following ways in order to narrow the gap between lower attaining children and their peers, provide resources and support for able learners to fully challenge themselves and to provide emotional wellbeing to raise self-esteem and confidence:

How will the money be spent?	Approximate amount spent	Impact
TA support in the classrooms	£7500	To provide children in receipt of PP with extra support; one to one support to provide precision teaching to accelerate progress for lower attaining, one to one and small group support to provide additional challenge for more able learners, preparation of additional resources
Woodlands Outreach behavioural support	£750	Appropriate support for PP children with social, emotional and mental health needs so that those pupils can accelerate progress without impediments. Support has enabled child to access school provision. Staff have also received support to enable them to manage behaviour positively which has supported

Costs of a residential trip	£600	To enable PP children to participate in extracurricular activities, school trips and residential Three children were supported to access the residential trip enabling them to benefit trip from the rich learning experience and social engagement with peers
Costs of new uniform	£450	To ensure PP children are not excluded from activities due to inadequate uniform and equipment. Provision of correct school uniform and equipment promotes selfesteem, pride and confidence in children. Three pupil premium children have been provided with school uniform, which has enabled them to access events without any loss of self-esteem or confidence
Resources and equipment	£1200	To support and enhance PP children in all aspects of their education and emotional wellbeing. To provide tools to enable a child to manage his behaviour so that he has continued to access education.
Instrumental music lessons in curricular subjects.	£1500	To enable PP children who have shown a particular talent for music to access professional lessons to develop their talent and promote self-esteem. Through expressing themselves through art the children are using the skills needed for this discipline to support their improved performance in curricular subjects.
After School and holiday clubs	£1200	To enable PP children to participate in extracurricular activities, school trips and residential holidays Accessing extra-curricular activities, supports the children to enjoy school and learn through having fun, promoting confidence and self-esteem.
