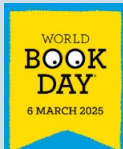


## Update from Mr Davda

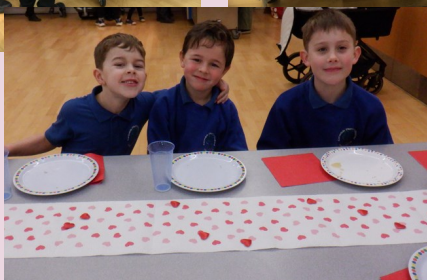
We're looking forward to starting the club again soon and introducing new members to the group, but will keep you all posted about our plans when we return after half term!



## CSA

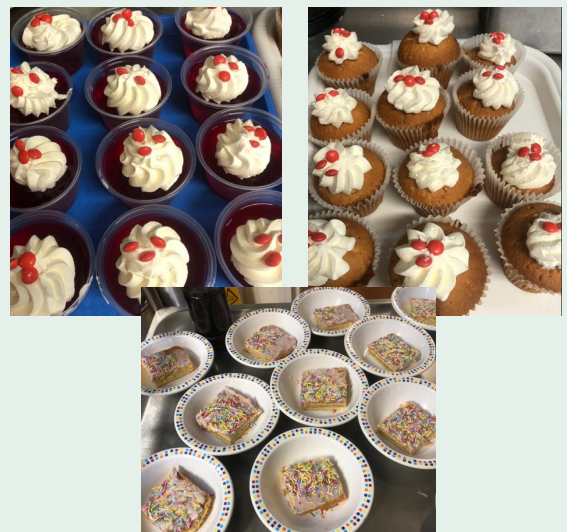
Thank you to everyone that came to our Valentines Breakfast today. It was wonderful to see so many children having a lovely time, whilst supporting our wonderful school.
